SUBJECT: Request for Special Retirement Coverage for Supervisory Firefighter Positions

Request the attached standard core personnel documents (SCPD) be covered under the special retirement provisions for firefighters. This coverage is requested for the Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) IAW 5 USC 8336(c) and the Federal Employees' Retirement System (FERS) IAW 5 USC 8412(d).

Coverage of these positions is required due to changes in the classification of firefighter positions when the current standard was updated on 3 March 2004. Based on DoD policy, DoD components must apply the new standard by 3 September 2004 (six months from the date of issue). Major changes in the classification standard include supervising work when responding to hazardous materials incidents, performing basic and intermediate life support, and performing paramedic duties. Therefore, respectfully request an expeditious review of these new supervisory firefighter SCPDs. In our opinion, the attached positions should be covered as secondary.
