## WHO WE ARE

The Air Force Wounded Warrior Program is a Congressionally mandated and federally funded Department of the Air Force program providing comprehensive non-medical support and advocacy for seriously wounded, ill, and injured Total Force servicemembers.

## WHAT WE DO

The goal of the Air Force Wounded Warrior Program is to ensure a fit and lethal force by supporting recovering servicemembers' transition back to duty while ensuring their needs are met. When that's not feasible, the Program provides personalized non-medical care management during the separation or retirement process with a warm hand-off to the VA for continued care and access to resources.

### RECOVERY

- Connect Airmen and Guardians with programs and resources.
- Ensure Airmen and Guardians receive the entitlements and benefits available based on their individual circumstances.

### REHABILITATION

- Maintain personalized care and assistance after their transition back to work or to veteran status.
- Provide professional services such as transition assistance, employment assistance, moving assistance, financial counseling, information and referral, and emergency financial assistance.

### REINTEGRATION

- Assist with applying for retention using the Limited Assignment Status Program.
- Assist in improving their career goals and connecting them to career resources and opportunities.


